Out of the Depths: The Psalms Speak for Us Today

Few books of the Bible capture the full range of human emotion like the Psalms. From the highest highs to the lowest lows, the Psalter has been the prayer book of God's people for centuries. It models for us how to pray – with lament and praise, by looking back and looking forward, with faith and doubt, etc. These 150 prayer poems have a rich and varied history, and they have much to speak to us today. In the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic and economic hardship, in the midst of our country's inequalities and polarization, the psalms provide a guiding light and a provocative word. They invite us to bring all that we are to God in prayer, to rest in God, "our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble" (Psalm 46:1). Join us for this nine-week class as we study different genres of psalms (lament, thanksgiving, hymn, narrative, etc.) and apply them to our personal and communal lives of faith. The class will meet over Zoom for at 8:30 am for an hour each Sunday (from September 20 through November 15).
