### **Spiritual Practice: Sacred Breath**

As a way of entering your time of prayer, take time to get in touch with your breathing. Don't try to change the rhythm of your breath; simply notice your natural, rhythmic rise and fall. Imagine as you breath in that God breathes life into you. As you breath out, imagine releasing all of the distractions and worries that keep you from being fully present in prayer. See if you can just set them aside for a time. Simply spending time with your breath as a way of deepening your awareness of the God who sustains you moment by moment is enough. Take time to become aware of your breathing, and allow your heart to fill with gratitude for this most basic gift of life.




**From the desk of Sue Sklansky,

As I purged my office files, I discovered that I have been part of the Nominating Committee as a church member, then a staff liaison for ten years. My first year was under the tutelage of friend and fellow bibliophile, Andy Hansen. As an organized and fastidious librarian, Andy took the duty of the Nominating Committee with serious determination.

The word I learned from him that first year was DISCERNMENT. The Christian use of that word: to obtain spiritual guidance and understanding. I have remembered each year that guiding the committee in determining each new elder or deacon is the process of discernment - both on the part of the nominee and the committee representing the congregation. It is never about who we like or who we think should be doing more. We ask nominees to prayerfully discern for several days before deciding.

If the right “spiritual guidance and understanding” is provided we should have a wonderful slate of new elders and deacons for the **Congregational Meeting on Sunday, June 24**. Please pray for the committee’s work in the coming weeks and for the nominees that are presently prayerfully discerning their call to serve in this much needed leadership role.

We believe that questions are transforming the answers, and we’re interested both in what the Bible meant (to its first hearers) and what it means (to us today). We apply St. Augustine’s “rule of love” (i.e. all faithful interpretations of

Scripture will promote a love of God and neighbor). Currently, our group is studying the book of Genesis and would love to have you join us weekly, monthly, or whenever you are able.
