


Our Common Life Week of September 18th, 2022

5 Weeks, 8:45 - 9:45 am Sundays (Sept. 18 - Oct. 16)

Join us for an engaging adult formation class this fall, led by Pastor Jeff, using the provocative book by Debbie Blue, "Consider the Birds: A Provocative Guide to Birds of the Bible." From the well-known image of the dove to the rooster that announced Peter's betrayal, birds play a dynamic role in Scripture. VIRTUAL EVENT WITH ARTIST, SUYUN SON Tues, September 20, 7-8 pm (Zoom)


