Spiritual Practice for Advent: The Light of Christ

Begin with a period of silence. Light a candle, if possible in a room with enough darkness that the candle's light shines brightly. Look at the flame and observe the life that is in it—its movement and brightness, how the flame is never still. Allow yourself time to watch the light it sheds, to watch the darkness and the shadows. Light is a gift from God.

Give yourself time to get in touch with the light of Christ shining in the places in our city, country, and world facing the greatest challenges. Repeat the following phrase multiple times, “the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it” (John 1:5). Meditate on the fact that the darkness never overcomes God's light.

Recall Christ's promise that he would dwell in us. His light is in us, not just outside of us. How might Christ's light shine inside you so you can serve as God's vessel of hope and healing?

CALL TO CONFESSION

A series of experiments by the psychologists Janine Willis and Alexander Todorov taught the world that it only takes a *tenth* of a second for us to form an impression of a stranger. In other words, it only takes a tenth of a second for us to look at someone's face and determine a stereotype about who they are. With decisions happening that quickly, it is not hard to imagine why we might need this moment of confession. The prayer of confession is an opportunity to slow down. We take that tenth of a second and give it room to breathe. We reflect on the decisions that we've made this past week and we ask for God's mercy to be in all of them. And without fail, God wiggles God's self into the cracks of our lives, and we are made better for it. So with that confidence, let us go to God, first in silent prayer.

PRAYER OF CONFESSION (unison)

God of mercy, a million times a day we have the opportunity to be gracious, to assume the best in others, to give the benefit of the doubt. A million times a day we could choose the better way, but so often we don't. Fear and greed kick in. Assumptions and insecurities take the wheel. Comparison and critique lead the charge. Forgive us for forgetting that we are descendants of Joseph. Forgive us for forgetting that grace and mercy are in our blood. Forgive us for forgetting that all belong to you. Give us the courage to love even bigger than before, and the wisdom to choose a better way. Amen.
