

Racial Justice Pilgrimage November 2 through 5

In November, First Pres Wilmette will be sponsor a racial justice pilgrimage to a number of important historic civil rights sites in Birmingham, Selma and Montgomery, Alabama. While specific plans for the pilgrimage are still in the development stage, the itinerary will likely include the Edmund Pettis Bridge in Selma; the Legacy Museum, the National Memorial for Peace and Justice and the Civil Rights Museum in Montgomery; the Civil Rights Memorial, and the 16th Street Baptist Church in Birmingham.

The tour will begin in Birmingham on Thursday morning, November 2 and end back in Birmingham on Sunday, November 5. Travel arrangements include direct flights from/to O'Hare or carpooling with other participants if that is preferred.

Cost of the trip is estimated to be around \$2000 per person...although costs are yet to be finalized. A \$500 deposit is required by April 15 to hold your place in the tour group.

Racial Justice Pilgrimage: Introducing Tour Leader Barry McNealy

Barry McNealy is the preferred tour guide of the Birmingham Convention Bureau and the Alabama Tourism Department. Barry is a high school history teacher, adjunct professor at an area community college, and works for the Birmingham Civil Rights Institute, in addition to giving guided tours in both Birmingham and Montgomery. Barry will make Alabama history come alive for

our group as he has for countless others including our friends at Kenilworth Union Church who toured the area last fall.

Chancel Choir to sing "Gospel Mass" Sunday, April 23 at 10:00 am

Come hear the joyful and soulful sounds of this inspiring work in worship as the proclamation of the word on **Sunday, April 23** at **10:00** am. A rhythm ensemble of bass, piano and drums (our own Ray Hopkins!) will accompany the choir.

Robert Ray's Gospel Mass, composed in 1978, premiered at the University of Illinois with a performance by the University's Black Chorus. Ray wrote it while serving as a liturgy team leader for the National Office of Black Catholics. In the Gospel Mass,

Dr. Ray's interprets two thousand years of liturgical tradition with the more contemporary music of the African-American Church. For centuries, composers have created musical settings from the text of the Ordinary of the Mass. Each setting creates a different feeling about the worship experience within the listener. The composer states: "It is my desire to combine centuries of old traditions of Mass settings with sounds of the contemporary Black Church. The move from Latin to English created new opportunities for composers to express their feelings about the texts of the Ordinary of the Mass. I wanted everyone to experience the sense of joy and celebration that is generally felt in true African-American worship."




