




# Racial Justice Speakers on the American Prison System and Possibilities for Reform

Austen's new book, *Correction: Parole, Prison, and the Possibility of Change*, will appear in bookstores in November; his previous publications appeared in the *New York Times Magazine* and other national publications. He won awards and award nominations for his first book, *High-Risers: Cabrini-Green and the Fate of American Public Housing*, released in 2018.
