
Tower Benefit Dinner and Silent Auction

Racial Justice Pilgrimage in November 2023


In November, First Pres Wilmette will sponsor a racial justice pilgrimage to important civil rights sites in Alabama. We have extended the pilgrimage registration deadline to **June 1st** as we still have few openings on the trip. Our goal is to have between 20 and 25 First Pres Wilmette members in the group. We currently have 15 registrants. If we don't have a full contingent from our congregation by June 1st, we plan to open registration to other churches in our community as several people outside our congregation have expressed interest in joining us.
